### **Snowshoe Trails**

#### Nomad 1.7 km

The trail starts at the wax cabin at the intersection with the Dragon Back ski trail. This trail winds through the trees on our private land between the driveway, Dynamite and the Jean Paulson Lodge. It is signed and marked with green ribbons.

# Mad Trapper 3 km

This trail heads out on the Omineca Main from the wax cabin and tours through plantations from the Rowan to the Aspen Rise and back through by the biathlon range. It is signed and marked with pink/yellow ribbons.

On the main trail there is a steep gully to go through. To bypass this gully you can continue straight on the Omineca Main to the Rowan and re-connect with the trail on the other side of the gully. The bypass trail is ribboned and signed.

## Other Trails in the Area:

Bear Den's Trail - leaves the Omineca Main Trail approx. 1.2 km from the lodge.

South Burns Lake (LEDA) Trail - the Mad Trapper uses part of the LEDA trail where it is parallel to the Aspen Rise/Nightmare. The LEDA trail is about 8.5 km in length.

The Mad Trapper ends near the Biathlon Range. Please stay on the trail and do not climb the berm that surrounds it.
