

Grooming:

Our groomers work tirelessly throughout the winter to ensure our trails are in tiptop shape. Once there is a base, grooming will generally occur on a 3 day cycle or once there is an accumulation of snow greater than 5cm. Trail grooming and conditions are available on the website and the Facebook page.

Note: there are some conditions when grooming is not recommended or it's preferred to do a full rotation of grooming so snow accumulation may be greater than 5cm on certain trails at times. Please be understanding and enjoy the fresh snow!

Trail Etiquette:

To ensure that everyone has an enjoyable ski, please follow these few simple rules:

- Do not walk or snowshoe on set tracks
- OSC is a no-tracking club, faster skiers are to step out of track to go around slower skiers
- Ski in control! Descending skiers have right of way
- Ski trails suited to your ability.
 - Blue = easy
 - Red = Moderate
 - Black = Difficult
- Do not obstruct the trail – if stopping, step to the side
- Dogs are welcome on the DOG TRAIL only
- For safety, always ski with a partner or check-in with someone

Spud Mountain Trails:

Please note these trails are off the OSC recreation area and are 'ski at your own risk' although they will be groomed periodically as time permits. During certain times of the year there are animal traps set up by a local trapper – please use caution if taking your dog with you.




Inset Map - "Lit Trails"




Omineca Ski Club Trail System
