Competition Venue:

The event will be held at the Omineca Ski Club. We are situated 6 km south of the Village of Burns Lake on Highway 35 (highway to Francois Lake).

At the traffic lights at the Overwaitea mall, turn south onto Highway 35. Drive straight out of town and the ski club is on the left hand side of the road just 6 km out of town. There is a blue skier sign at our driveway. A map showing the location of the club can be found on the last page of this invitation.

The Jean Paulson Lodge is a full service building with a concession and large social room. It will be open: Friday from noon until 2200 hours (there is a full moon ski festival) Saturday from 0800 hours to 2200 hours (dinner and award ceremony) Sunday from 0800 hours to 1600 hours

Eligibility to Participate:

All athletes and coaches must be registered participants with Biathlon Canada or US Biathlon to participate. Biathlon BC members in good standing are eligible to receive full benefit of results in Biathlon BC programs such as BC Cup points, team or squad selection. Any member of Biathlon Canada or other IBU Nations in good standing may enter but will not be eligible for Biathlon BC programs and awards.

Rules:

International Biathlon Union (IBU) rules and regulations shall apply as fully as possible. Biathlon Canada rules shall apply for classes not covered in IBU rules with modified rules for Junior Boys/Girls and younger classes as per the Biathlon BC Hosting Policy as of November, 2016.

Rifle Import Regulations:

Teams and individual competitors from outside of Canada must declare their rifles at the Canadian border, complete the necessary documentation and pay the required fees when bringing rifles and ammunition into Canada. All athletes must register their own rifles and pay the applicable fee. Please refer to the guidelines on the Canadian Government website at: www.cbsa.asfc.gc.ca/import/iefw-iefa-eng.html

Registration:

All registration must be done online through Zone4. Registration will open by January 10, 2017 and can be found by searching for "Biathlon BC Cup #4". There will also be a direct link posted from the Omineca Ski Club website <u>www.ominecaskiclub.ca</u> No other registration is allowed. **Registration will close at midnight, Monday, February 6th, 2017**

Payment must be made using a credit card. Registration processing fees will be paid by the host club.

Entry Fees:

\$35.00 per Athlete, per competition in the following classes: Junior B/G, Senior B/G, Youth M/W, Junior M/W, Men/Women.

\$30.00 per Athlete, per competition in the following classes: Juvenile, Midget, Cadet, Recreational and Masters.

Day Memberships:

Those wishing to compete who are not registered participants with Biathlon Canada or an IBU member nation must purchase a Day Membership for each day of the competition. This must be done when registering on Zone4.

Cadets at Biathlon BC Competition:

Cadets are welcome to participate in BC Cups. If the cadet participates in the Cadet competition class and is "under orders" and supervised by his/her cadet corps then he/she does

not need a Biathlon BC membership. However, if the cadet wants to compete in another class other than the cadet class they must purchase an athlete membership. If they want to participate in a Recreational Class they must purchase a Biathlon BC Day Membership if they do not have one of the athlete memberships.

Cancellation Policy:

There are no refunds if a competitor does not show up for the competition. If a competitor withdraws at least one week (by February 3rd, 2017) prior to the event, they may apply for a 75% refund. If the event is cancelled one week ahead (by Friday, February 3rd, 2017) entry fees (minus registration costs) will be refunded. If unforeseen circumstances cause cancellation closer to the event, the organizers may retain entry fees sufficient to ensure no loss against monies already spent.

Classes of Competition:

*Age is determined at December 31, 2016. An athlete who is 16 years of age by the end of December in the year that starts the winter competition season may elect to compete in either the Senior Boys/Senior Girls and not carry his/her rifle OR may compete as a Youth Man/Youth Woman and must carry his/her rifle. This selection is made when registering on Zone4 and cannot be changed later.

Please note that course distances may vary slightly from posted distances.

Trail Passes:

There is no requirement for participating athletes, coaches or officials to purchase a day pass for skiing on the trails throughout the full period of the event (Friday to Sunday). However, you must sign the group waiver form posted outside the Race Office.

Competition Office:

The competition office is located in the Jean Paulson Lodge.

Bib pickup will be outside of the competition office (inside the lodge foyer). On Saturday it is from 0900 hours to 0930 hours and on Sunday it is from 0800 hours to 0830 hours.

Team Captain's Meeting:

The team captain's meeting will be held Friday, February 10th, 2017 at 1900 hours in the Jean Paulson Lodge (back room).

Banquet:

OSC will host a banquet on Saturday night in the Jean Paulson Lodge. Dinner will start at 1730 hours and it will be followed by the award ceremony and possibly musical entertainment. Please note that seating is limited and meal tickets must be purchased ahead of time. The cost is \$15 per person (age 12 and under) and \$20 per person (age 13+). In order to guarantee seating you must prepay with your registration. A limited number of tickets, if available, will be for sale on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning (in the lodge) if supplies last. Concession:

There will be a concession open all day Saturday and Sunday during the open hours of the lodge. Food will be available for purchase. Breakfast and lunch will be available both days. Breakfast will include baked items, fresh fruit and yogurt. Lunch will include a hot meal of soup or chili plus baked items.

Please note that there are limited options for breakfast in Burns Lake on Sunday morning prior to the competition start.

Waxing Facilities:

The Omineca Ski Club has an indoor waxing facility but it has limited space and it will be on a first come first serve basis. There will be ample designated outdoor spaces available with electric plug-ins. All medium (MF) and high (HF) fluoro waxes must be applied outdoors.
